

Síkh Weddings



A Sikh wedding celebrates love, spirituality, and community. Embrace the traditions and create an event that reflects the couple's personalities while honouring their cultural heritage.

Pre-Wedding:

- 1. Roka Ceremony: This is the engagement and exchange of gifts between families.
- 2. Chunni: The groom's family gifts the bride, including a chunni (scarf).
- 3. Mehndi/Sangeet: Host a lively night of music, dance, and henna application. Book a professional Henna Artist for the Mehndi ceremony.
- 4. Haldi and Maiyan Ceremonies: Apply turmeric paste to the Bride and Groom for cleansing and good luck.
- 5. Ghara Gharoli: Bride's family fetches water for her ceremonial bath.

Wedding Day / Anand Karaj:

- 1. Anand Karaj: The Sikh wedding ceremony in a Gurdwara around the Guru Granth Sahib, and taking blessings.
- 2. Same day, sign marriage contract to follow UK legal regulations, to ensure that the marriage is officially registered by law in country.

Post-Wedding:

1. Reception: A celebration of the newlyweds with food, music, and dancing.

2. Doli: Send off the bride as she leaves her parents' home officially.

3. Pag Phera: The Bride returns to her parents' home for a visit.

4. Langar and Seva: Providing a service at the Gurudwara for guests and the less fortunate.
